It is then, the responsibility of each person (participant, organisers, officials, etc.) involved in the FIM Cup, to always refer to the most updated and accurate versions available.

The Organiser also commits to respect as much as possible the "Green line" charter good practice.

Any modifications to these SR will only be announced by numbered and dated amendments, issued by the Organizer, and previously approved by the FIM or FMB and by the International Jury of the Event.

Any references to the male gender in this document refer also to the female gender except where the context requires otherwise.

6. NUMBER OF PARTICIPANTS & CLASSES


Number of participants: Unlimited. But riders will be allocated in groups for free and time training. The groups are depending of the number of riders present at the race. The time training will define in which group the rider will take part for the 2 heats. Groups will be formed by max 15 riders on the track.

A 2nd bike is allowed for each rider or as teambike where the extra bike can be used by more teammembers. This must be announced during the technical control. It is strictly forbidden to change e-Bike during the race.

Classes: EX 3 & EX 4 Light-Moto

EX3 / EX4 (minimum age*: 16 years and/or age limit imposed by the laws and regulations of the FMNR).

EX3 & EX4 are electric vehicles equipped with a throttle and cut out switch can take part in the EX3 (with pedals) EX4 (with pegs) class as described below:



7. ENTRIES & DEPOSIT

Applications for entry shall be made via following electronic form: Entry form FIM EX-bike World Cup Mons 30/04/2023 - FMB BMB (fmb-bmb.be)

Applications shall be approved by the rider's FMN and shall reach the organizers no later than 21 april 2023.

The organizer will select the applications and advice teams within 72 hours after the closing date of entries whether their applications have been accepted or rejected.

The entry fee is **25 Euros**.

The number plate will be distributed at the administrative control by entering the circuit. The number plate must NOT be returned to the organiser after the race.

The transponders will be distributed at together with the numberplate. The maximum deposit amount for transponders is $\underline{100} \in$.

8. TECHNICAL INSPECTION

No rider nor E-Bike are permitted onto the track unless they have passed the technical inspections which will be held according to the following schedule:

Sunday 30 April 2023 from <u>07.30</u> to <u>09.30 Hrs</u>

Change and charging of batteries is allowed between the races

Please also refer to the Time schedule at the Art. 17 below.

9. PRACTISING

It is strictly forbidden to ride E-Bikes on the course outside the official practice periods.

11. PRIZE-GIVING

12. PROTESTS

13. INSURANCES

Rider's Insurance:

By endorsing the application form for entry, the FMN of the rider certifies that the rider is insured in accordance with the FIM requirements.

Please refer to "Information Notice_FIM rider'sinsurance programme 23-24" (see Appendix 3).

Third Party Liability Insurance

In conformity with Art. 110.1 of the Sporting Code (see below), the third party liability insurance will be the responsibility of the organiser.

Art. 110.1.1 Third Party Liability Insurance for FIM World Championships and Prize Events without an FIM promoter

The organiser of a FIM Championship or Prize Event must provide the FIM Administration, not later than 20 days prior to the event, with a copy of the insurance policy written in English or French to cover his own liability and that of all participants, the manufacturers, riders, passengers, sponsors and officials in case of damage to third parties during the meeting or during the practices. The insurance policy shall also cover any possible liability of the FIM to third parties.

The <u>minimum amount of coverage</u>, <u>which shall not be less than the minimum standards provided for by the national laws</u> of the country in which the relevant event is taking place, is defined regularly by the Board of Directors and published and circulated by the FIM.

The third party liability insurance will come into effect two days before the official practice session and will terminate two days after the last race day.

This insurance includes a guarantee of 2,500,000,00 € per victime & 5,000,000,00 € per disastre.

The organiser disclaims all responsibility for damage to an E-Bike, its accessories and components arising out of an accident, fire or other cases.

14. RENUNCIATION OF ANY RECOURSE AGAINST SPORTING AUTHORITIES

Apart from the requirements of the FIM Sporting Code, riders and teams by participating in a FIM event, renounce all rights of appeal against the organiser, his representatives or agents by arbitration or before a tribunal or any other manner not foreseen by the FIM Sporting Code for any damages for which they could be liable in consequence of all acts or omissions on the part of the organiser, his officials, representatives or agents in the application of these regulations or contributed to or arising out of their actions.

15. RIDER'S EQUIPMENT

An on-board-camera (other than the one from the FIM TV Crew when present or permitted by the FIM Administration) is not allowed during the entire event, from the practice sessions until the end of the event.

If riders wish to place their own on-board camera, they must contact the TV Department of the FIM Administration, for approval.

FIM Riders' insurance information

The rider's insurance policy set up by the FIM is a service for all the Federations that are part of the programme

for the period from January 1, 2023 to December 31, 2024.

Who is covered:

- Riders with a FIM licence issued by a Federation which is part of the FIM riders' insurance programme.
- Riders with a FIM licence issued by ACCR, DMSB, FMS, KNMV, NMF and SMF are not part of the FIM riders' insurance programme and must follow the guidelines of their respective Federation.
- Riders competing in MotoGP, Moto2, Moto3 and MotoE are not part of the FIM riders' insurance programme and must follow the guidelines of their respective Federation.
- Riders competing in a Cross Country Rally must follow the guideline of the Rally organiser.

Validity of the insurance:

- For all events on the FIM Calendar with an International Manifestation Number (IMN).
- For racing activities included in the official programme of the event only!
- - Travel to and from the event venue.

Scope of coverage:

In case of racing incident, the FIM riders' insurance programme would cover:

- Emergency Medical treatment on the event's place (subsidiary and complementary to any other insurances the rider may hold)
- Repatriation to the rider's country of residence (as declared on the FIM Licence extranet by the rider's FMN)
- **Death and Disability** (Riders with a FIM licence issued by FFM and FMI have not subscribed this benefit from the FIM riders' insurance programme and must follow the guidelines of their respective Federation for this benefit)

Please note that this is an EMERGENCY insurance and in order to avoid any problems please follow the correct procedure.

What to do?

Before departure:

- Always check beforehand whether your personal health insurance card is still valid.
- For European citizens, please travel with your European Health insurance card.

In case of an Emergency Incident / Urgent medical assistance need:

When contacting any of the claims team you will need to provide:

- Your FIM licence number and your contact details
- > The FIM event number: IMN
- > The venue of the event

Important notes:

- · When you are being transported to hospital for medical examinations treatment and/or assessment:
 - Always take your documents related to your personal health insurance and to the FIM riders' insurance programme when you are being transported.
- When receiving medical assistance at the event/hospital:
 - You/a nominated representative must always receive a complete clinical record of all medical examinations, treatment and assessment.
- Always provide the insurance file number provided to you during your first call.



- Make sure your Federation indicates the correct country of residence in your details and your correct emergency
 and authorized contact persons. Any repatriation will be to the address/country provided by your Federation on
 the FIM Extranet site.
- The FIM riders' insurance programme is only valid at FIM-approved events with a valid Number (IMN). If you are attending private test and/or non-event practice days, YOU WILL NOT BE COVERED by the FIM insurance.
- Always follow the instructions or you may no longer be covered by the FIM riders' insurance programme!
- Please ensure you agree upon any medical care or medical arrangements with the FIM insurer before taking any action whatsoever!



- Do not delay in contacting the emergency helpline. Make the call as soon as you can to advise of your accident!
- Do not change or leave the hospital, before contacting the emergency claims line, or the FIM insurance services may not be provided.
- Do not leave the country in which the incident occurred, before contacting the emergency claims line, or the FIM Insurance services may not be provided.
